



**SAJP SPECIAL ISSUE: A REVIEW OF SOUTH AFRICAN PSYCHOLOGY** Modern South African psychology has its early roots in the last decade of the 19th century, being consolidated into a distinct science in Stellenbosch in 1918 and in Cape Town two years later. It is apposite for the next quadrennial International Congress of Psychology to be held in Cape Town next July. This will be the first time, since it advent in Paris in 1889, for this flagship event in the international psychology calendar to be held in Africa, and only the second in the Southern Hemisphere. To highlight the various and chequered roles that psychology has played in South Africa, a Special Issue of the SAJP will be published in the fourth quarter of 2012.
