This workshop has a practical hands-on approach to trauma intervention and crisis management with children. This workshop gives participants innovative and effective tools with which to help children who have experienced traumatic bereavement, exposure to crime and violence, natural disasters, and gruesome accident scenes, as well as any other emotional trauma. Looking at both group debriefing as well as individual interventions, this workshop will equip professionals who work with children and their parents to be able to offer first line assistance, and so doing, to minimise longer term trauma-related problems in children.
