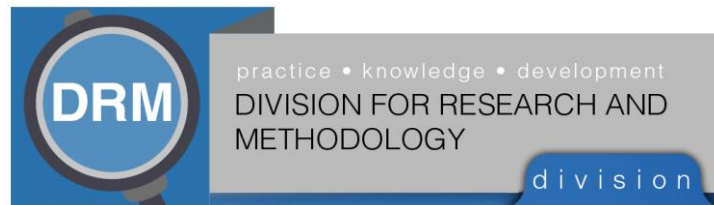

How to nominate/self-nominate

To nominate a DRM member or to self-nominate, you will need to complete a Google Form which includes a 200-500 word motivation letter and submit all the relevant documentation as outlined in the award guide below.

Nominees must be a current DRM member for the year 2019 and in good standing with PsySSA. Persons may be nominated/self-nominate for more than one award.

Once all applications are received, they will be anonymised and reviewed by the awards committee of the DRM

1. Most Active DRM Member in PsySSA Congress 2019 – This award recognises the contribution of DRM members at the PsySSA Congress 2019.

- No applications are required for this award.
- It is based on member engagement at the conference which includes number of presentations in the congress programme.
- Members must be present at the DRM AGM to receive this award.

2. Academic Engagement – This award recognises outstanding academic engagement which contributes to transformation in South Africa and the decolonization of science.

Applicants should be in the postgraduate period of their studies up to post PhD (of no longer than four years ago).
