Lara Sheehi, PsyD (she/her) teaches decolonial, liberatory and anti-oppressive theories and approaches to clinical treatment, case conceptualization, and community consultation at the George Washington University Professional Psychology Program. She is the founding director of the Psychoanalysis and the Arab World Lab. She is president-elect of the Society for Psychoanalysis and Psychoanalytic Psychology (APA Division 39), and the chair of the Teachers' Academy of the American Psychoanalytic Association. She is co-editor of *Studies in Gender and Sexuality*; co-editor of "CounterSpace" in *Psychoanalysis, Culture, and Society* and on the editorial board for the *Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association*. Lara is on the advisory board to the USA–Palestine Mental Health Network and *Psychoanalysis for Pride*.

Stephen Sheehi, (he/him) is currently the Sultan Qaboos Professor of Middle East Studies in the Asian and Middle East Studies Program, Arab Studies Program, and Asian and Pacific-Islander American Studies Program at William & Mary, where he also is the founding Director of the Decolonizing Humanities Project. Professor Sheehi is author of a number of books, articles, book chapters, commentaries; most recently, his co-authored book with Lara Sheehi, *Psychoanalysis Under Occupation: Practicing Resistance in Palestine* (Routledge, 2022) and *Camera Palaestina: Photography and the Displaced Histories of Palestine* co-authored with S. Tamari and I. Nassar (University of California Press, 2022). He is the editorial boards of *Trans-Asian Photography*, *Regards: Revue des arts du spectacle*, and Routledge's *Decolonizing the Classics* series and the advisory boards of the USA–Palestine Mental Health Network and *Milestones: Commentary on the Islamic World*.
