PROFESSOR ZAHRA ALI

Zahra Ali is Assistant Professor of Sociology at Rutgers University-Newark, and leads the Critical Studies of Iraq initiative that centers knowledge making from social scientists and feminists in Iraq.

As a sociologist, her research explores the dynamics of women and gender, race, and class, as well as social and political movements concerning Islam(s), the Middle East, and contexts of war and conflict with a focus on contemporary Iraq. She is interested in (racial) capitalism, (post) coloniality, decolonial, and transnational feminisms as well as critical knowledge production and epistemologies, especially about global and public sociology.

Her book *Women and Gender in Iraq* is a sociology of women, gender, and feminisms in contemporary Iraq drawing from transnational and postcolonial feminist theory and based on work conducted in the country following the US invasion and occupation.

Ali is currently working on a new book *Uprisings and the Political Imagination*, that shifts the dominant lens of social theory in analyzing mass protests away from a binary approach of power/resistance by looking at "the political" from the point of view of life, space, violence, and emancipation.

PROFESSOR SATHS COOPER

Saths Cooper is President of the Pan-African Psychology Union and a stalwart of the Black Consciousness Movement and was a close comrade of the late Steve Biko. He was elected as publicity secretary of the Black Peoples Convention at its founding conference in 1973 and has been banned, house-arrested, and jailed for 9 years – spending 6 years on Robben Island. After his release in 1981, he joined the Azanian Peoples Organisation (AZAPO) and served at different times as vice-president and President. He is a graduate of the Universities of SA, Witwatersrand, and Boston, where he obtained his PhD in Clinical/Community Psychology.

He was the first Black chair of the regulatory Professional Board for Psychology at the Health Professions Council of SA and is also a former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Durban-Westville. He holds professorial appointments at the Universities of Pretoria and Stellenbosch and is a Past President of the International Union of Psychological Science.
