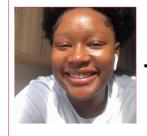

Faresani

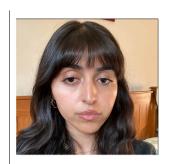
My name is Dzhombere Faresani, a Masters student at the university of Venda. Passionate about helping others help themselves, by combining empathy with research to support lasting personal growth.

Pebetsi

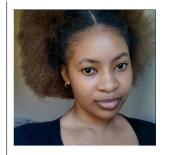

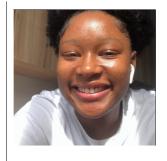




Andiswe
